

HAVE A SAFE AND HAP-PY FALL THIS 2018!



We are still having some nice weather as the leaves begin to fall from the trees and I see a few more outdoor BBQ's on the horizon. As the temperature starts cooling down I start drinking hot tea again, and baking. With the holidays coming, the oven is calling me to bake, roast, and broil for the family. Warmth from the oven on colder days while the family is gathered around visiting with one another brings warmth to my heart. Attention to the decorations in the attic are prompting me to take them down and start making plans for the holiday festivities once more. Our new kitten is now 16 months old and I want a Christmas tree this year. How to set up a tree that is safe from the cat and the cat safe from the tree will be the challenge for this Christmas season.

Speaking of safety; we live on the corner of a very busy intersection where there are 2 lanes in each direction with a center turn lane, which intersects with a 4-lane County highway. Recently, we've had a couple of separate incidences where someone came to the front door wanting to borrow the phone for an emergency call. The first time was a few months ago when I answered the door and there was a man on the front porch. The second time was last week when my husband, Pat, answered the door when a woman was knocking. In both cases the time was between 1:30 a.m. and 3:00 a.m. when the person insisted on coming inside the house to make the call. When admittance inside was declined in each case, the individual became upset and started to demand that we let them inside! In each case the person was informed that it wasn't necessary to come inside to make a call with a cordless phone and offered to dial 911 for them. They each became more demanding to come inside! We each held our ground and refused admittance; finally, the individuals gave up, then we went back in the house and made sure all the doors and windows were locked tight and stayed up for a while to make sure all was safe. We are now

installing a new security system of cameras that can record activity when motion is detected, and we have a monitor set up in the house to view what the camera is seeing all the time. There is also an App we installed on our smart phones where we set up warnings to be sent to us if Motion is detected as well. I want to add that I always carry my house key with me when I answer the door, step outside and lock the door behind me when I don't know the person. In the past I've had individuals who shoved me out of the way and forced their way into my home. These people are like Vampires once they are inside and very hard to get them out even with police assistance. Be safe and be aware of strangers! In the future the door will NOT be opened. I can dial the phone from inside a locked door to render assistance quite easily and if that's not good enough, 911 will do me very nicely thank-you-very-much.

On the subject of making calls, I am receiving signals on my Yaesu FTM-100DR/DE and can hear talking on the radio; but, no one seems to hear me when I transmit. Our new 2-meter antenna isn't working out very well and I think I'll put the old vertical antenna back up. I still have my Yaesu VX-8 which works well and can be used in a pinch. My husband Pat was also having trouble on the Kenwood TS 440S HF-Transceiver and gave up trying to get back on the air. He suggested I need help getting the Ham Shack up and running but couldn't seem to explain what problem he was having. I will try to track down what is happening and see what I can do. I need to learn more about troubleshooting and acquire some diagnostic equipment. Might need help from a local Elmer to get it up and running. Stay warm and safe this winter!

MINOW Meeting Minutes May 5, 2018

Attendees:

Reports:
